The TCOM chapter of Sigma Sigma Phi, a national osteopathic honor society, will sponsor the first annual Medical Seminar from 8:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m., April 23, at the Ramada Inn, according to student-doctor Robert Marsh, seminar chairman. Topic for the one-day event will be gastroenterology.

Speakers will be Dr. Jay Beckwith, clinical associate professor of medicine; Dr. Robert Nelson, clinical associate professor of radiology; Dr. Ivan Danhof, professor of physiology at The University of Texas Health Science Center (UTHSC) at Dallas; and Dr. Allen Rubin, clinical assistant professor of internal medicine at UTHSC at Dallas.

Areas to be discussed by the speakers are peptic ulcer disease, Dr. Beckwith; gall bladder disease. Dr. Nelson; gastric hormones, Dr. Danhof; and malabsorption, Dr. Rubin.
